



Message from the Executive Director



The CIC is excited to announce that it is hosting an open meeting on April 26th at the brand-new Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library. This meeting is an opportunity to connect with different government offices, nonprofits, and community organizations to better serve the incarcerated population of DC. The event is two hours, during which CIC staff will provide a presentation and hold a Q&A session at the end of the event. The CIC hopes to see many community members there. On March 8th, the CIC published a thematic report on the implementation of the Restore the Vote Amendment Act of 2020. This act ensures that all DC residents in custody can register to vote. The Act also requires that the DC Department of Corrections (DOC) become an automatic voter registration agency. Because people from DC who are incarcerated for a felony conviction are confined in the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP), implementation of the Act requires coordination with the BOP and the DOC. In the report, we highlight successes and ongoing challenges in the implementation effort. The report is available [HERE](#).

On March 17th, the CIC published an additional thematic report summarizing correctional policies for transgender, gender non-conforming, and intersex DC residents in custody. The report summarizes the DOC and the BOP's program statements regarding the housing, classification, and treatment of Transgender, Gender Non-Conforming, and Intersex residents. The BOP sent the CIC comments on the USP McCreary Inspection Report, and the fully incorporated report was published on March 23rd. The report details CIC's visit to USP McCreary on December 13th and 14th, 2022. Included are recommendations for the facility based on staff's findings and the BOP's responses to the findings. 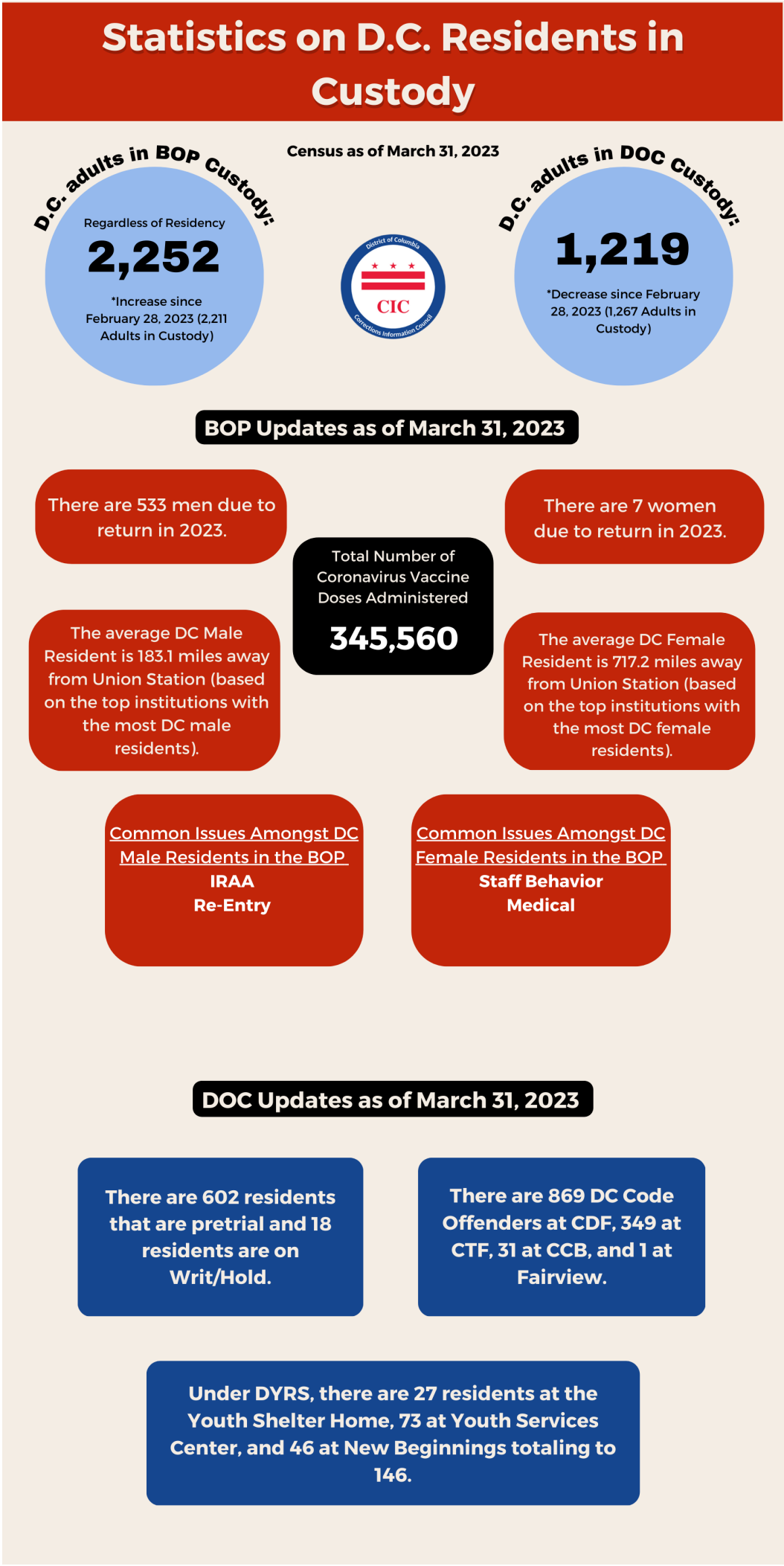


