BOP Updates

The average age of DC Adults in BOP custody is approximately 40 years old.

57% of male DC Code
Offenders are located in
medium and low security
facilities.

There are 78 female DC Code Offenders.

63% are located in medium, low, and minimum security institutions.

The remainder are located in BOP camps or administrative security (eg. medical and transfer facilities).

There are no women in high security facilities.

DOC Updates

There are 1,154 residents that are pretrial.

There are 129 residents housed in the DOC for parole violations (increase).

The amount of DC residents in DOC custody is approximately 4% higher than it was in April 2024.

There are 1,337 DC Code
Offenders at CDF (increase),
619 at CTF (decrease), 30 at
CCB (decrease), and 3 at
Fairview (decrease).

Under DYRS, there are 33 residents at the Youth Shelter Home (decrease), 108 at Youth Services Center (increase), and 52 at New Beginnings (increase) totaling 193.
