### **Message from the Executive Director**





Discipline and Punish: The Birth of the Prison by Michel Foucault

Discipline and Punish is an analysis of the historical shift from corporal punishment and torture to today's prison system that focuses on torturing the mind. Foucault critiques the idea that modern prisons are humane by discussing the "carceral network" that extends into all aspects of society (including schools, businesses, and the military) and disempowers individuals while enforcing social norms.
